Taking new patients. To obtain care at this clinic, please call directly. Sliding scale. Proof of Eligibility not required, but birth certificate or passport (photo ID) would help. Clinic accepts homeless individuals regardless of age & individuals 30 years of age and younger regardless of homeless status, Injection Drug Users (IDU's), urban day laborers, sex workers, monolingual Spanish speakers meeting any of the criteria above. Chinese Medicine, Transgender Clinic, & Tattoo Removal *do not* restrict based on age or homeless status.
